

Lord Wolfington's Cranberry Orange Scones

Inspired by one of our favorite picture books, *Mr. Pumpkin's Tea Party* written and illustrated by Erin Barker, Lord Wolfington's Cranberry Orange Scones are easy and fun to make!

Recipe and Ingredients

Lord Wolfington's Scones

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups all-purpose flou
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
- 2 tablespoons orange zes
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, cold, shredded using a cheese grater
- 1/2 cup heavy whipping cream, cold
- 1/2 cup dried cranberrie
- 2 teaspoons sanding or other coarse sugar (optional)
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/4 cup orange juice, strained



- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 2. In a large bowl, place the flour, sugar, baking powder, salt, and
- 3. Mix dry ingredients with a whisk until well combined
- 4. Add the cold, shredded butter to the mixture.
- Mix using your hands until it resembles coarse crumbs (pea-sized chunks are good).
- Pour in the cold heavy whipping cream.
- 7. Fold it into the dry mixture, starting with a whisk or other stirring utensil, and then use your hands as the dough starts to come together
- Add the dried cranberries, making sure to not overwork the dough too much.
- 9. On a lightly floured surface, bring the dough together a little mor and then shape it into a large disk, roughly 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches thick.
- 10. Cut out scones using a circular cookie cutter.

- 11. Place the scones onto a baking sheet lined with parchment, sprinkle with sanding sugar (the sugar is optional, but adds a nice texture to the top!).
- 12. Bake in the oven for 20-25 minutes, or until slightly golden brown on the top and bottom.
- 13. Let the scones cool to room temperature while you make the glaze
- 14. For the glaze: Whisk together the powdered sugar and orange juice in a large bowl.
- 15. Drizzle the glaze over the scones in whatever way you'd like and enjoy!






Odd Animals ABC's Word Search

Hungry Henry's Octopus Paper Plate Craft

Make this cute paper plate octopus with a few supplies and easy steps. Inspired by our board book, *Hungry Henry*.



Supplies:

- -Paper plate
- -Yellow paint
- -Glue stick
- -Scissors
- -Black washable marker or crayon
- -Red washable marker or crayon,
- -Yellow, white, and red construction paper







Hungry Henry's Octopus Paper Plate Craft

Directions:

- 1. Paint the paper plate yellow.
- 2. Trace a 6.5" diameter circle onto the red paper and cut out. There are several ways to do this; you can cut a circle out of a second paper plate and trace it, or you can use a household item such as a cereal bowl turned upside down to trace. Or freehand it, if you're really daring!
- 3. Fold the red circle in half, then fold in half again and crease. Unfold the circle.








- 4. Using the creases in the paper as a guide, draw 2 straight lines to form a cross, dividing the circle into fourths. Then draw 2 more lines diagonally so you have a total of 8 sections.
- 5. Cut 8 small triangular indents around the edge of the circle—one at the end of each line.





- 6. Now take a piece of white paper and fold it in half. Draw a small circle (about 1.5" in diameter) onto the paper and cut it out. These circles will be the eyes.
- 7. Color pupils onto each eye using black marker, then glue the eyes onto the red circle. Add a mouth below the eyes.





- 8. Fold a piece of yellow paper in half and draw four legs at different lengths. Cut them out and you will have 8 legs. With your glue stick, apply glue to the tops of the legs, as shown below.
- 9. Glue the legs to the body. (Note: Some people find it easier to glue the two leg pieces together before attaching to the body.)






And there you have it! A friendly octopus who's ready to join you on all kinds of adventures! What will you name it?


